SMARTIE COOKIE RECIPE

- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 ¼ tsp. baking soda
- ¼ tsp. salt
- ¾ cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- 2/3 cup granulated white sugar
- 2/3 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 large egg yolk
- 1 ½ tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup Smarties candies

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, whisk together, flour, baking soda & salt.

In separate bowl, beat the butter & sugars until light & fluffy. (about 2-3 minutes). Scrape down the sides of bowl. Add the egg & egg yolk, beating until well combined. Beat in vanilla extract. Gradually add the flour mixture to the creamed mixture & beat just until incorporated.

Scrape down the sides of the bowl as needed. (if batter is soft, cover & refrigerate for 30-60 minutes or until firm.) Place six balls of dough on each baking sheet. Gently flatten each ball of dough. Completely cover the tops of the cookies with the Smarties. Gently press the candies into the dough. Bake for about 14-17 minutes, rotating the baking sheets halfway through the baking time. Cookies are done when they are light golden brown in colour & just set around the edges. They will still seem a little soft in the center as they cool.
